2025 Spring Grants

The Kays Foundation selected two grants to fund in the spring grant cycle totaling \$60,052.00. The first grant was awarded to Dr. Nicholas Balla, Director of Bands, in the Department of Music for the "Sound of the Natural State Marching Band" for \$13,440.00. The second grant awarded was to Dr. Brook Fluker, associate professor of aquatic ecology in the Department of Biological Sciences, for the "Modernization of fisheries equipment in support of students in Biological and Environmental Sciences" in the amount of 46,612.00.

Kays Foundation awarded Dr. Haran in the Department of Mechanical Engineering funds to participate in the Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE) Baja International Competition held at Williamsport, PA in May of 2024. The A-State students named their team "Red Wolves Racers." They traveled, designed and assembled their vehicle and competed in the international competition which is limited to 100 schools worldwide. A-State undergraduate mechanical engineering students were involved in building the newer version of the Baja vehicle for the 2024 competition. The vehicle will be utilized for teaching, outreach and recruitment efforts when it is taken on the road or displayed at events on or near the campus.
